Some names on a bottle (i.e. Raveneau in Chablis) almost always guarantee an excellent wine. In the Sancerre hamlet of Bue, that name is Crochet. Bue makes the most chalky, elegant and refined – so for us the most archetypal – Sancerres. And for quite some time, the shining beacon of quality in Bue has been Lucien Crochet’s “Le Chene”.

Crochet’s brilliant “Le Chene” is simply the most intense and ethereal (and great) we’ve tasted. But the hot new producer in Bue is Daniel Crochet. His style is a bit fuller, though perhaps a bit less rarefied than Lucien’s. And the prices – at least for now – are remarkably low for a wine so good, and so sought after.

This is a superb and archetypal Sancerre.
